Spring is here and it is that time again when the nastys of winter and leftover trash and rubbish show up more than ever. In an effort to have a clean municipality I respectfully ask that everyone make a conscious effort to clean their properties this year.

Here are some requirements that must be complied with. Swimming pools must have fences or be higher than 48 inches, or have a locking ladder, and must have pool alarms.

More than 2 or more inoperable or unlicensed motor vehicles on any premises are not permitted.

Check with the code enforcement officer to see if your project requires a Flood Plain Development permit, Zoning Permit, or a Building permit, before you build.

TOWN CEMETERIES

"STORIES FROM THE PAST"

This is the 4th in a series of articles written by Sandy Austin for the Town Newsletter about the Town cemeteries. There are some very old and interesting cemeteries which bring up some "stories from the past".

HILLSIDE CEMETERY.

Hillside Cemetery [which has been called the Nute Cemetery or the Joseph Stevens Farm Cemetery] is located on Route 415 [near Stony Ridge Road]. There are several burials from the Nute Family and the Stevens Family and some records indicate it was on the Stevens Farm. From the burial listings I concluded that the Stevens and the Nute families were related.



In the front row are two Campbell stones; one is Captain Solomon Campbell, a veteran of the Revolutionary War who died in 1823 at the age of 74; and the other, Solomon’s son, Col. Archibald Campbell, a veteran of the war of 1812, who died two years later at the age of 48, in 1825. They came to Campbell in 1801 with Solomon’s brother, Rev. Robert Campbell. Records show that Solomon Sr. and Archibald and others, including Solomon Jr. and Robert, which we believe to be the son of Robert the Town’s founder, were instrumental in founding the Painted Post Lodge of Free Masons No. 203, which was organized In 1808. Keep in mind that in 1808, Campbell

was part of the old Town of Painted Post which was established in 1793 and consisted of the town areas of Campbell, Hornby, Erwin, Corning, Lindley and Caton.

In those days, involvement with the Free Masons was taboo. It



was viewed as a un-Christian-like. It is believed that because of this feeling among the Townspeople, that Solomon and Archibald were not allowed to be buried in the Campbell family plot at what was to become Hope Cemetery, so they buried them along the road where it would become Hillside Cemetery. Solomon Sr. and Archibald passed away within 2 years of each other in 1823 and 1825, so it makes sense that they are side by side and that their stones are so similar.

Records show that Sarah Campbell, who died in 1852, the wife of Archibald, is also buried there but with no marker.
