Call To Order/Pledge /Roll Call/ Prior Minutes.

Mr. Horton called the regular monthly meeting to order at 7 p.m. at the meeting room of the Campbell Town Hall and led the pledge of allegiance. The Town Clerk then took roll call. The minutes of June 15, 2020 were noted.

REPORTS

Monthly Reports Filed.

It was noted that monthly Town Supervisor's Report dated July 13, 2020 was received from Wendy Oman the Town Bookkeeper, a Copy was filed with the Town Clerk. A report dated July 09, 2020 was received from DCO Randy Akins and is on file with the Town Clerk.

Highway Report (Thomas Austin)

Tom received information that the 2020 CHIPS Funds will be reduced by 20%. This does not affect the funds remaining from last year. End of August first part of September for paving. Quotes from companies Chemung Contracting, will not do business with Brother Paving due to bump on Tannery Road that they refused to fix. Brother Paving has been placed on the "unfit bidder" list. Terry Wheat suggested to send the bill through the lawyer to have the road fixed.

Hot Patch on Eccles Road and Savona Campbell Road, 10 loads of gravel were removed from Green Hill Creek. The highway crew has been working on grading, ditches, and sluice pipe repairs.

Water Report (Thomas Austin)

There was a lightning strike at the water plant that messed up tone of the analog modules, Roger from Panalogic said it could be fixed. The cost of the part is \$2,581.00 but he could find it on EBay for 30% less. Tom asked him to get the part from EBay.

The \$40,000.00 Water Ext Fund Balance Modification is necessary to move forward with the design from HUNT Engineering for the new Water Ext District – this will be reimbursed to General Acct once the Water Ext acct is established and funded by WIAA grant.

The \$37,871.38 Fund Balance Modification is the amount owed by the Town General acct for the final Kraft Tax Litigation Refund Settlement for years 2016 – 2018.

The \$3,819.10 Fund Balance Modification is the amount owed by the Lighting District for the final Kraft Tax Litigation Refund Settlement for years 2016 – 2018. The General Acct needs to lend to the Lighting district until the 2021 budget, at which time the General Acct will be reimbursed.

RESOLUTION # 6 OF 2020

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF CAMPBELL TOWN BOARD REGARDING SETTLEMENT OF LITIGATION RELATING TO CERTAIN NEW YORK ARTICLE 7 REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW ASSESSMENT CHALLENGES

At a regularly scheduled meeting of the Town of Campbell Town Board held on July 13, 2020, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town of Campbell is the Respondent in litigation commenced by and on behalf of Petitioners Kraft General Foods, Inc. and UNC Real Estate I, LLC ("Petitioners"), under Index No(s) 2015-0932CV, 2016-0758CV, and 2017-0781CV challenging the tax assessments pertaining to the premises commonly known as 8600 Main Street, Campbell, New York, for the tax years 2015-2016, 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 pursuant to New York Article 7 Real Property Tax Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Campbell and the Petitioners have reached a settlement in connection with the above-referenced tax assessment challenges, consistent with the terms of the Stipulation of Settlement, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Stipulation of Settlement, the Town of Campbell's proportionate share of any refund(s) owed to Petitioner totals Forty One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Dollars and 48/100 cents (\$41,690.48), including Thirty-Seven Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy One Dollars and 38/100 Cents (\$37,871.38) from General Fund, Three Thousand Eight Hundred Nineteen Dollars and 10/100 cents (\$3,819.10) from Lighting District; and

WHEREAS, the County of Steuben, through its Finance Department, has expressed a willingness to coordinate the payment of the refunds owed to Petitioners; it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the Town of Campbell Town Board is hereby authorized to take all necessary steps to finalize the settlement of the aforementioned tax assessment challenges, including authorizing its counsel to execute the Stipulation of Settlement; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town of Campbell Town Board is authorized to issue payment to the County of Steuben Finance Department in the amount of Forty One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Dollars and 48/100 cents (\$41,690.48)
